Bob Hodge has coached the Buccaneer Women's Tennis team for over 25 seasons, beginning in 1984. Over that time, he has compiled a 240-141 dual meet record, including a 149-60 mark in Midwest Conference play. His teams have won five MWC titles, including three straight from 2000-02, and too-numerous-to-mention individual champions. He retired from his position as a Professor of History at Beloit College in 2008, a position he held for 40 years.

### Young Players Step Up in 2010

The 2010 Beloit College Women's Tennis team was a mixture of young and old, with the young stepping forward and leading the way while gaining valuable experience for the future.

"At the beginning of the season we knew that our younger players would fill important roles on the team," said head coach Bob Hodge. "With three sophomores and a freshman in the regular line-up, along with two seniors, the younger players needed to mature quickly under fire. And they did, which only bodes well for the future of the program."

Sophomores Ashley Miglin, Emma Beck and Taylor Jones showed the experience they had gained as first-year players in 2009 didn't go to waste. Miglin fashioned a team-best 14-3 Singles record and was runner-up at the

MWC Championships in #6 Singles; Beck finished 13-6 and advanced to the MWC Championship semifinals in #4 Singles; and Jones, despite an 8-10 regular season mark, won the Consolation Championship in #3 Singles at the MWC Tourney.

Miglin also combined with senior Lily Rubenstein to finish as runner-ups in #3 Doubles at the MWC Championships.

"We got what we expected from the three sophomores," said Hodge. "They're hard workers who respond in key situations. They will only get better."

First-year player Alex Hinck was thrown into the fire immediately, holding down the #1 Singles position all season long, finishing at 5-14.

"Alex was in a tough spot but she never let up," continued Hodge. "For the most part she was up against juniors and seniors in every match but she never gave in. That competition will only make her a better player for the next three seasons for Beloit."

Senior Julia Win, a four-year letterwinner, held the #2 spot and scored a 6-13 overall record. She also played #2 Doubles with Hinck as the two put together a 10-9 mark.

"Julia really filled a big role for this team," Hodge said. "She was the only player on this year's squad with four years of experience. She was a good player and real competitor her entire time."

Hodge sees only good for 2011 and beyond as four regulars return.

"We're looking for players who are ready to step in and contribute immediately," said Hodge. "Since we graduate four seniors we would like to recruit at least four new student-athletes for 2011. Those newcomers will have an excellent opportunity to get into the starting lineup."

## **THIS IS BELOIT COLLEGE**

Beloit College was founded in 1846, when Wisconsin was still a territory. The early curriculum was built on the classical tradition, but students were given an unusual amount of freedom to choose their own courses. Today, Beloit is recognized for its longstanding commitment to curricular innovation, and its first-year initiatives and international education programs.

The Beloit College community is diverse and noted for its passionate engagement with ideas and the world. Its 1200 students are from nearly every state, the District of Columbia, and more than 40 nations. Twenty percent of its students are non-Caucasian; ten percent come from countries other than the United States. No more than ten percent of a graduating class is represented in any one of Beloit's majors.

98% of Beloit's 103 full-time faculty members hold a Ph.D. or the highest degree in their field. Teaching is the faculty's highest priority but all professors are active scholars and artists. Many are leaders in educational reform. Professors serve as mentors, guides, and partners on research projects and academic work. A strong tradition of student-teacher collaboration contributes to the college's lively intellectual community.

Beloit offers more than fifty majors, more than thirty minors, and a number of dual-degree and preprofessional programs. A flexible curriculum, grounded in rigorous study encourages independent research, fieldwork, and collaboration with peers and professors. Coursework is interdisciplinary, experiential, and global in scope.

The average class size is 15 students; Beloit's student-to-faculty ratio is 11:1.

Beloit's wooded forty-acre campus includes twenty-eight buildings in a range of architectural styles; four buildings are listed on the National or State Register of Historic Places. The campus is marked by winding pathways, expansive lawns, displays of public art, and ancient Indian mounds.

The college's academic facilities include the internationally recognized Logan Museum of Anthropology, the Wright Museum of Art, a state of the art performing arts complex and research labs equipped with advanced technology. Beloit offers more than thirty international programs, dozens of domestic study programs, and hundreds of internships and field study programs.
