

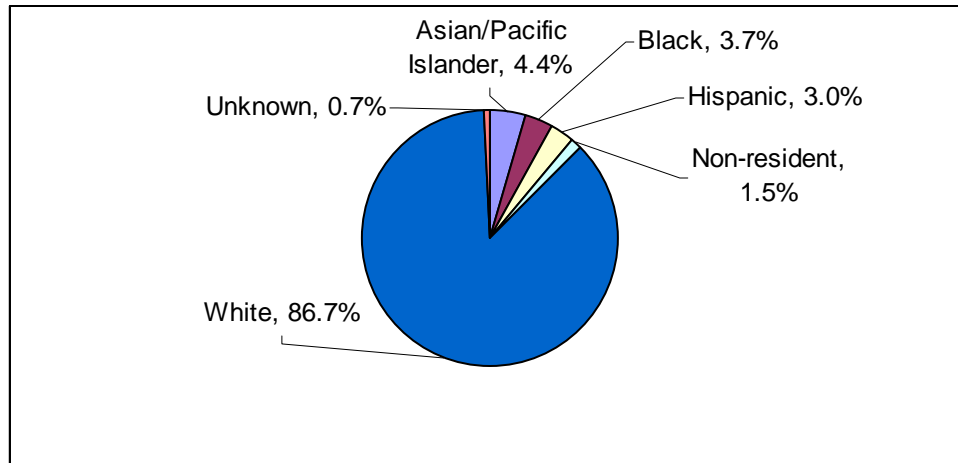
Fast Facts About Beloit's Faculty & Academics

As of September 6, 2007, there were 98 tenured and tenure-track and 40 visiting or adjunct faculty at Beloit College, 10 of whom are sabbatical/leave replacements. Of these 138 individuals, 93% are considered full-time (at least .5 FTE) and 93% have terminal degrees in their field. The number of faculty in each department during the Fall 2007 semester is in the table below.

Approximately 42% of Beloit's faculty are female. The racial and ethnic composition of the faculty is presented in the graph below:



The average length of service of Beloit's tenured/tenure-track faculty is 14.23 years; adjunct and visiting faculty have an average length of service of 4.16 years. Twenty-six members of the faculty have served the college for more than 20 years.

Academics

The student-faculty ratio for the Fall 2007 semester is 11:1, with an average class size of 15. Of the 351 courses with active enrollments on September 6, 2007, only 3 regular courses (0.8%) had more than 35 students, while 102 (29%) had 10 or fewer students. The graph below depicts the percentage of all courses offered in each disciplinary area for the Fall 2007 semester.
