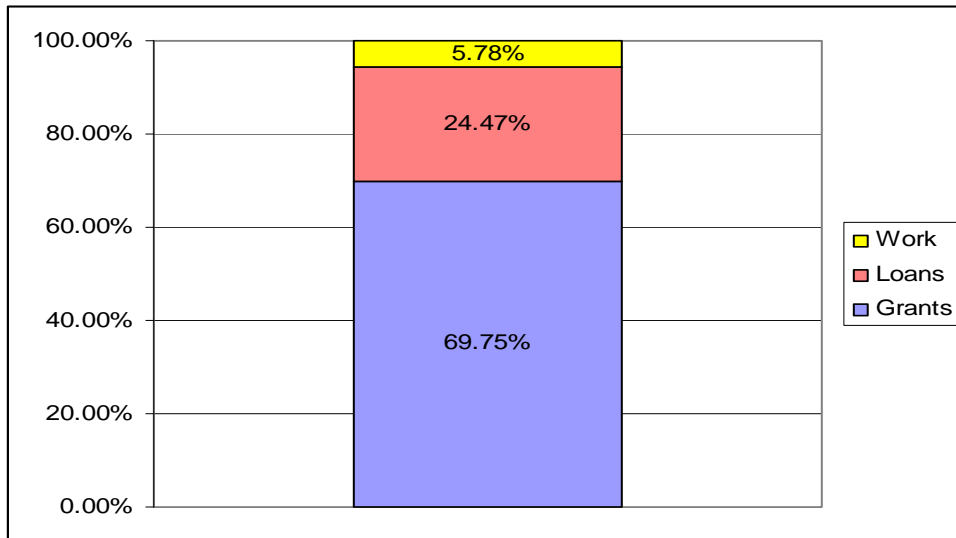


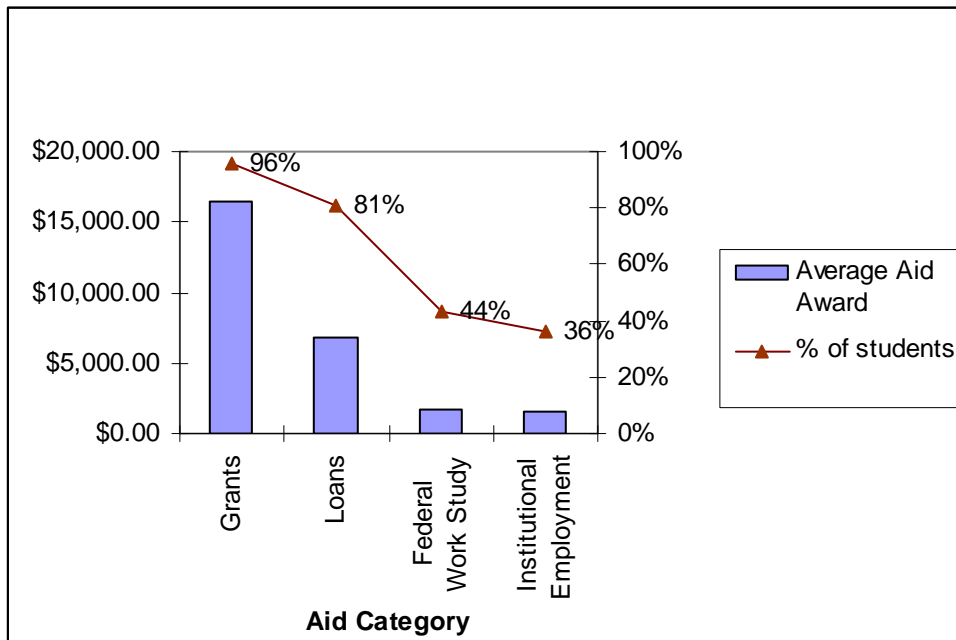
## Fast Facts About Beloit's Financial Aid

Of the 1306 degree-seeking students enrolled in classes at Beloit as of August 31, 2007, **90%** receive at least some financial aid (not including loans to parents).

The average total aid package awarded for the 2007-08 academic year was \$22,528.02; this includes grants, loans to students (not parents), and federal or college work-study. The average proportion of aid coming from each source is shown below:

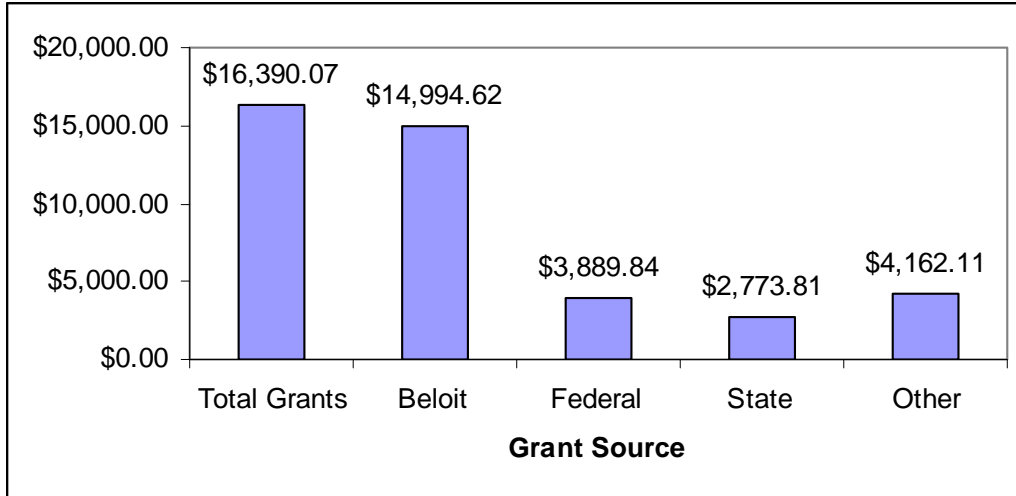


Of those students receiving aid, the percentage receiving grants, loans, work study, and college employment, as well as the average award amounts, are found in the graph below:



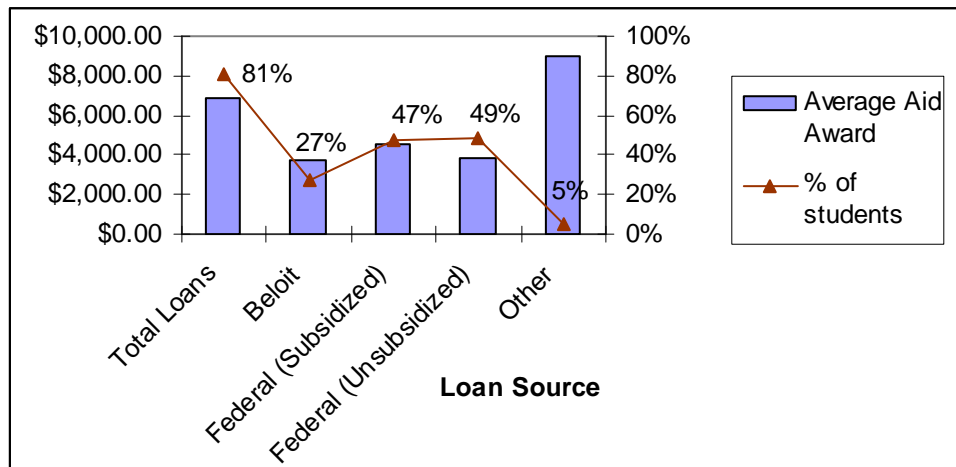
### Grants

Students may receive grants from 4 main sources: Beloit College, the federal government, state governments, and outside agencies or organizations. Of students who receive aid, 95% obtain grant aid from Beloit College. The average grant aid awarded by each grant source for the 2007-08 academic year is found in the graph below:



### Loans

Loans to students (not parents) may come from Beloit College, the federal government (these can be either subsidized or unsubsidized), and private organizations and agencies. The average loan amounts granted by these agencies and the percentage of students receiving aid who obtained these loans for the 2007-08 academic year is depicted in the graph below:



For May 2007 graduates who had loans, the median 4-year cumulative loan amount was \$19,695.
